

Comal TAB: Partners in Community Research

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


Introduction










Results



Our Current Project: Domestic Violence in Comal County


Purpose:

To better understand the community's awareness of domestic violence as well as their familiarity with local resources for preventing and addressing domestic violence.

Methods:

- Comal County Health Summit Dec 5, 2014
- Convenience sample: n=38
- Volunteer respondents 18 or older
- Self-administered
- English only
- Approximately 5-10 minutes to complete
- 2 primary domestic violence questions w/ sub-questions
