

# Practitioner Engagement in Activities of the National Dental Practice-Based Research Network (PBRN): 7-Year Results

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


### Background & Purpose

The purpose of this review of the National Dental Practice-Based Research Network (PBRN) was to:

- 1. Quantify practitioner activities of the Network for which Continuing Education (CE) credits were received (study training, videos, webinars, meetings, and symposia)
- 2. Quantify practitioner coauthoring Network publications and presentations
- 3. Test whether practitioner characteristics were associated with participation in these activities.

# Results





### Materials and Methods

- A retrospective analysis was conducted of practitioners who enrolled between April 12, 2012 and October 12, 2018 and activities as of December 17, 2018
- Data were gathered through Enrollment Questionnaires and previously awarded CE credits
- A total of N=4,361 dentists were in the study (See Table 1 for common practitioner characteristics)

#### **Results Continued**

Being a general practitioner (vs specialist) and having more experience since time of graduation, were more strongly associated with these activities

#### Conclusions

- 1. These activities were successful in sustaining a high level of practitioner engagement in clinical research and its relevance to everyday clinical practice
- 2. Most activities were related to evidencebased dentistry and improving oral health and not only provided dissemination of study results, but also encouraged an environment to build collegiality
- 3. Practitioners have stated intentions to change practice behavior as a consequence of study results disseminated at meetings
- 4. Regional Coordinators serve as a catalyst to engage practitioners in Network activities, allowing them to be part of the research process from start to finish
