





## **RESULTS**


Many (88%) dental practitioners do not ask about violence exposure, but most agree that screening patients for signs of violence is apart of their professional role.

- The average comfort level of assist persons with violent exposure was 6.5%
- Looking for possible participation
  61.8% were interested in participating in the study
