The Institute for Integration of Medicine and Science (IIMS), home to the NIH Institutional Clinical and Translational Science Award (CTSA) at UT Health San Antonio, is soliciting applications for the K12 Mentored Research Career Development Program. The K12 (formerly KL2) program targets early career faculty with a professional doctoral degree or individuals completing postdoctoral training with an impending academic appointment. K12 Scholars are selected on a competitive basis and will embark on a 2-3—year program of intensive training in clinical and translational research and translational science, combining an innovative educational program with mentored clinical and translational research. Completing the program is expected to position the K12 Scholar for a leadership role as an independent clinical and translational researcher/translational scientist in academic medicine, industry, or government.

Qualifications include a doctoral health professional degree or PhD and a keen interest in a career that focuses on clinical and translational research/translational science. Early career faculty from diverse disciplines including physicians, epidemiologists, behavioral scientists, biostatisticians, informaticians, pharmacologists, dentists, nurses, psychologists, engineers, and others are sought. All applicants must hold or be guaranteed a faculty position in effect July 1, 2025 at any of the following campuses, with the position not being contingent on receiving a K12 award: UT Health San Antonio, UTSA, UT College of Pharmacy (San Antonio campus), UT Austin, UT School of Public Health (San Antonio regional campus), and Texas Biomedical Research Institute. **Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents**.

A minimum of 75% effort is **required** for each year of participation, with the exception of surgeons, who must devote a minimum of 50% effort on the K12. Successful candidates will receive up to \$120,000/year or 75% of their institutional base salary (whichever is less) and \$28,500/year in research and travel support. Scholars are expected to apply for an individual K award or R01 in Year 2.

The IIMS anticipates funding up to 4 new 2-3—year K12 Scholar positions available starting September 1, 2025. For each Scholar position, the IIMS will fund the first 2 years of a Scholar's award, with the Scholar's home department funding the third should the Scholar need it to obtain independent funding (individual K award or R01 or equivalent) as Pl. A 1-page letter of intent, an NIH-format biosketch, and your department's letter of support guaranteeing the third year of support are due Monday, March 3, 2025 at 5:00 pm. Application materials will then be reviewed, and selected applicants will be invited to submit a full K12 application due on May 21, 2025 at 5:00 pm.
