Robert Jamison, Ph.D.

Robert N. Jamison, Ph.D. is a Professor at Harvard Medical School in the Departments of Anesthesia, Psychiatry, and Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation and has over thirty five years' experience working with persons with chronic pain. Dr. Jamison is the Chief Psychologist at the Pain Management Center at Brigham and Women's Hospital, Boston where he directs a structured pain management program.

Dr. Jamison has received numerous grants from the NIH and has authored 2 books and over 250 peer-reviewed articles and chapters in the area of behavioral medicine and chronic pain. He has a long history of mentoring students, fellows, and junior faculty members. He is active in many national and international organizations and has been on the Board of Directors for the American Pain Society and is Past President of the New England Pain Association. Dr. Jamison has been a surveyor for the Commission on Accreditation of Rehabilitation Facilities and has served as principal investigator in many government and industry-sponsored research studies. He also serves on the editorial boards of five different journals, is a frequent ad hoc reviewer for other established medical journals, has served as a member of the NIH Behavioral Medicine and NIDA Study Sections, and has been the invited speaker at many national and international conferences.
